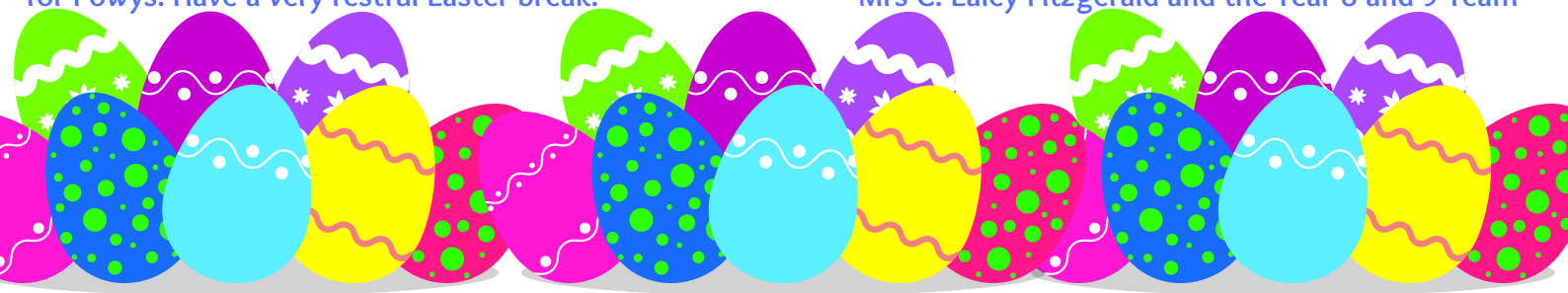

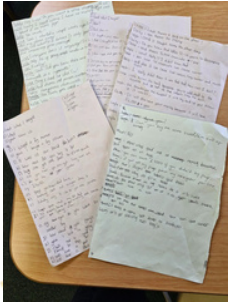

Year 8 Smoke Free Ambassadors

Many congratulations to the new Smoke Free Ambassadors who had been selected by the year group to represent the year 8's and become trained as representatives of the school. Our 20 youngsters were trained through 4 school sessions and a 2 day course run at Quackers by the NHS leaders to learn about the effects of smoking and the long lasting health and environment implications of people taking on the habit. Our learners were able to participate in the workshops whilst learning how to assist those who may be addicted to smoking and learn how to get help to support those who feel that they want to give up the unhealth habits including vaping. Each ambassador has a badge and a diary to monitor how they help others. The programme culminated with a year 8 presentation assembly for the year group in early March where the ambassadors read out facts about smoking and then recieved their certificates. They also shared the posters created from the end of the project.

You will be able to read about the GCSE/KS4 courses on offer in school and college. It would be worth visiting this and setting up folder areas on your home drive ready to start year 10 in June.

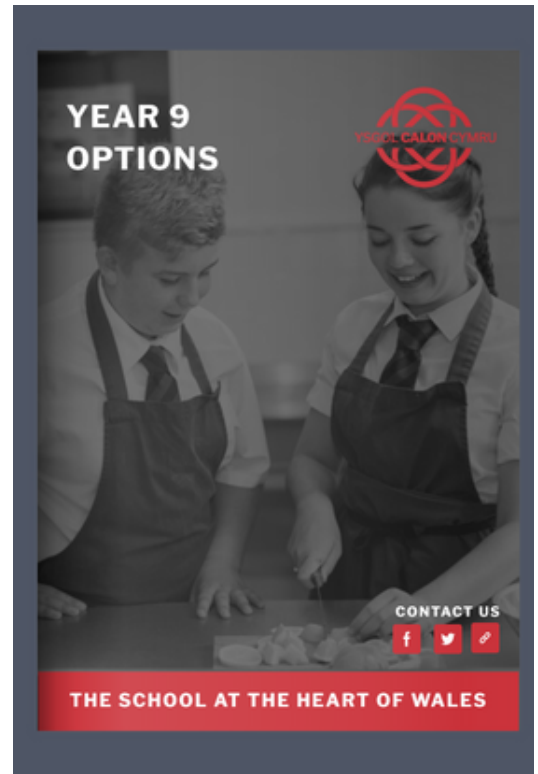
Some facts about Year 10:

Mr. Roberts will become your Progress Leader for the next 2 years. Current subjects that you don't want to take at GCSE will not appear on your year 10 timetable. You will be expected to do more homework and need a place to study in peace and quiet. You will need to be more organised to meet deadlines, revise and prepare for tests and start doing coursework in your free time. You may be joined by Builth Campus students or need to travel to BC for some GCSE subjects.

You will use your planner more frequently to remind you of dates and will also need to access Go4S for homework reminders. You should be checking Teams from home or a mobile device regularly and check your hwb email. Make sure that you download office and Teams onto your phone for use at home if you don't have a laptop or computer.

Coursework will play a big part of some subjects so you will need to complete work in your free time, which may mean that you have to be more organised with time after school. You may have to make notes, revise and do extra work. You could find out what type of learner you are to give yourself the best chance of how to study well.

Some exams will take place in Summer 2025, like short course RE, so not every course have their final exams in Year 11 and year 10 mocks will take place after February next year.
